

Individuals Reaching Out by Leonard Zev Muroff

I believe that one person can make a difference. I was a teenager on a youth tour to Israel when I first realized this. The person who convinced me was Danny Siegel, the poet, writer and Tzedakah messenger. It was through his efforts, that I saw that individuals with a vision and with much energy can have an impact.

I first met Danny Siegel in Israel in the summer of 1978. He had a clear and simple message torus that summer. Giving is not enough. One also had to do. Danny taught that we should not wait until we have the inclination to help others. Instead we should follow the teaching in the Schulchan Aruch which says that: " A person should give pleasantly, joyously, with a good heart, showing sympathy for the poor, sharing in his sense of pain and sorrow." It was upon this that Danny bases his entire approach to life. He himself expressed it best when he wrote in his booklet entitled Tzedakah Jewish Giving, A Privilege : " As a result of Menschlich acts, we will become more aware of the nature of being a Mensch. That is a basic Jewish idea- the doing forms the theory, and not the other way around. " Danny pointed out that the first step is to make doing an important part of our lives. He also helped us become aware of the segments of the population which universally need special attention.

By encouraging individuals to visit those less fortunate than

ourselves and to contribute our time, energy and money on their behalf, he was making a difference in the lives of those usually ignored by society.

Purim also provides us with an example of one person who is able to make a difference. Queen Esther could have chosen to sit back and not risk her comfortable and secure position. Instead, she risked her life and high social standing in the kingdom and approached King Ahashuerus regarding the plot by evil Hamen to exterminate the Jews. Esther did hesitate at first, as many of us do when confronted with the need to do something which makes us uncomfortable. Eventually, Esther did realize the severity of the situation. She is said to have remarked: "Then I shall go to the king, though it is contrary to the law; and if I am to perish, I shall perish!" (Esther 4:16) It was a bold step, yet it was one that Esther realized was necessary to take.

In 1980, I met another woman who is an example that one person can make a difference. I will call her " Jennifer " to protect her identity due to the sensitivity and confidentiality of much of what she does. She has worked unceasingly on behalf of Syrian Jews for over a decade. She too like Esther, could have sat back and remained secure in her world of comfort in her affluent neighborhood. Instead, once she realized the severity of the situation, she too chose to risk her life and to act. " Jennifer " has been able to improve the condition of the lives of the Jews who remain in Syria and to some

extent make it possible for some Jews to leave. In addition, she has sent Siddurim, Tailitat, Kippot, and Humashim to try to improve their quality of life in Syria. In the process she has done much to incur the wrath of the Syrian government.

That their quality of life is deplorable is not debatable. As residents of the only Arab country that did not allow its Jewish citizens to emigrate to Israel in 1948, or in any year since, their situation is especially precarious. On a daily basis, they face incidents of anti-Semitism at school, at work and even in their homes at night. They live with the knowledge that they are always at risk of being attacked verbally or physically.

Thus "Jennifer " 's contribution on their behalf is especially important. She has been a doer on a large scale. By raising money, speaking out on their behalf, forming committees to advance their cause and establishing a link with the Syrian Jews themselves, she has done much to ease their pain. From this we can see that one person can indeed make a real difference.

Things have only deteriorated in the year since I spoke to the Minyan about the plight of the Jews of Syria. The borders have been sealed, thus removing any chance of escape for these people. It is clear that they need our help. The examples of Danny Siegel and "Jennifer" show us that individuals can make a difference.






